

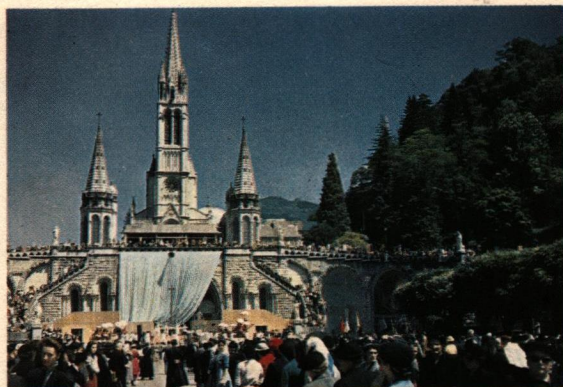
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# Program of Shore Excursions

**LA PALLICE:** Leave by special train on a three-day tour to Lourdes (our principal objective), where we will participate in the Marian Congress.

We will assist at Mass in the Grotto of the Apparitions at the very spot where, 100 years ago, Our Lady appeared to Bernadette and told the child, "I am the Immaculate Conception."



During our stay, we will join the impressive Procession of the Blessed Sacrament, and witness the Blessing of the Sick. At night, we will participate in the traditional Torchlight Procession.

Departing from Lourdes, we will cross the French-Spanish border, traveling along the Northern Coast of Spain to Bilbao, and at its port, Santurce, we rejoin our cruise ship, the OLYMPIA.

**VIGO:** Full-day tour to Santiago de Compostela. Traveling by special train, we visit the famed Shrine of St. James the Apostle at Santiago.

A Baroque jewel, set in a green valley, rimmed by distant peaks, Santiago de Compostela, a city built over the tomb of the "Son of Thunder," like no other town in Spain preserves with fresh integrity the full scope of the ancient glories of Iberia. Entering its Puertas, we step into both the spirit and the times of an ancient age. It is here that the body of the Apostle was miraculously transported after his Martyrdom in Jerusalem at the hands of Herod. After having been buried under the dust of centuries, it was miraculously re-discovered in 821 when Bishop Theodomiro, guided mysteriously by a star, discovered the tomb over which he erected the first Basilica.

The third and present Basilica (began in 1075) is reputed to be the world's most beautiful existing example of the best features of Baroque and Romanesque styles.

**LISBON:** Special full-day train tour to Fatima. We entrain at dock-side for our combination rail-motor coach visit to

the Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima, about 100 miles north of Lisbon, where Our Lady in 1917 appeared to Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta.

We visit the Shrine, housing a representation of the vision beheld by the children, which stands in the great Plaza before the magnificent, white marble Basilica and assist at Holy Mass.

**GIBRALTAR:** Time free for individual activity.

**MALAGA:** Half-day city tour by motor coach, driving past the shoreside bull ring and through the city, dominated to the north by the ruins of the Alcazaba, by the towers of its world-famous Renaissance Cathedral and the sharply rising mountains which seem to herd the city towards the sea. It was from Malaga, once one of the most important ports of the world, that many explorers departed for the Western World in former times.

In addition to the Alcazaba, we will see the Park, La Caleta, Limonar, Miramar, Puerta Oscura, and one of the famous wine bodegas.

**PALERMO:** Half-day tour of city and Monreale by motor coach, with luncheon ashore. After our ship has entered the ancient-walled harbor, we visit Palermo which lies half-way between the peninsula of Italy and North Africa. Here we see the historic Duomo, an outstanding example of Moorish influence on Romanesque architecture. We drive through the palm-lined streets to the Cathedral, Palatine Chapel and Cappuccini Monastery.

In Monreale, another splendid Cathedral dating from the Norman times and an ancient Benedictine Cloister are visited. Then, after luncheon at the Villa Igea, we transfer to the Piazza Verdi, in front of the Massimo Opera House in the center of the shopping district, before returning to our ship, the OLYMPIA.

**CRETE:** The largest and most beautiful of the Greek Islands, called the "birthplace of European Civilization." We visit Knossos, center of the Kingdom of Minos, whose history reaches back to 3500 B.C.

We enter Herakleion's Bay. Here, as elsewhere throughout the town, the Venetian influence is felt. Herakleion is a medieval town built by the Saracens in 824 A.D., and fortified by the Venetians with an enormous and impressive wall. In the old town can still be seen the Venetian houses and the fountain of Morosini.

**ATHENS:** Full-day tour of the city by motor coach, with luncheon ashore. The morning's itinerary includes the Theatre of Dionysus; the Acropolis; on the rocky hill overlooking the city, site of the most impressive ruins of Athens; the Parthenon, finest example of Greek architecture and design; and the lovely Erechtheum, whose roof is supported by the statues of six Greek maidens. 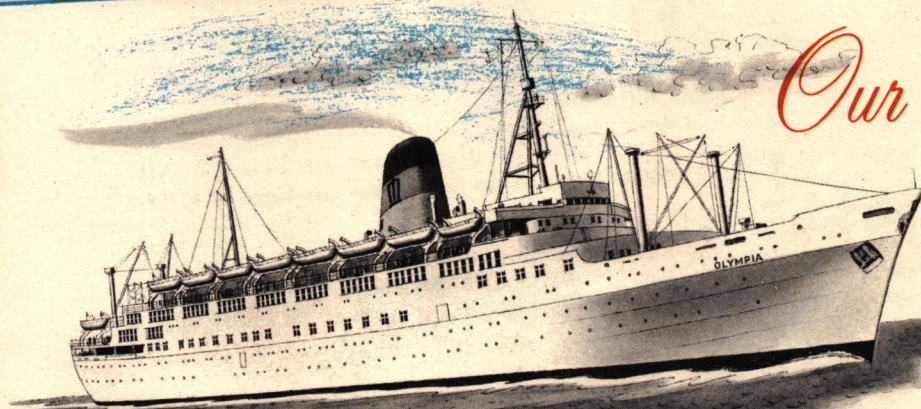
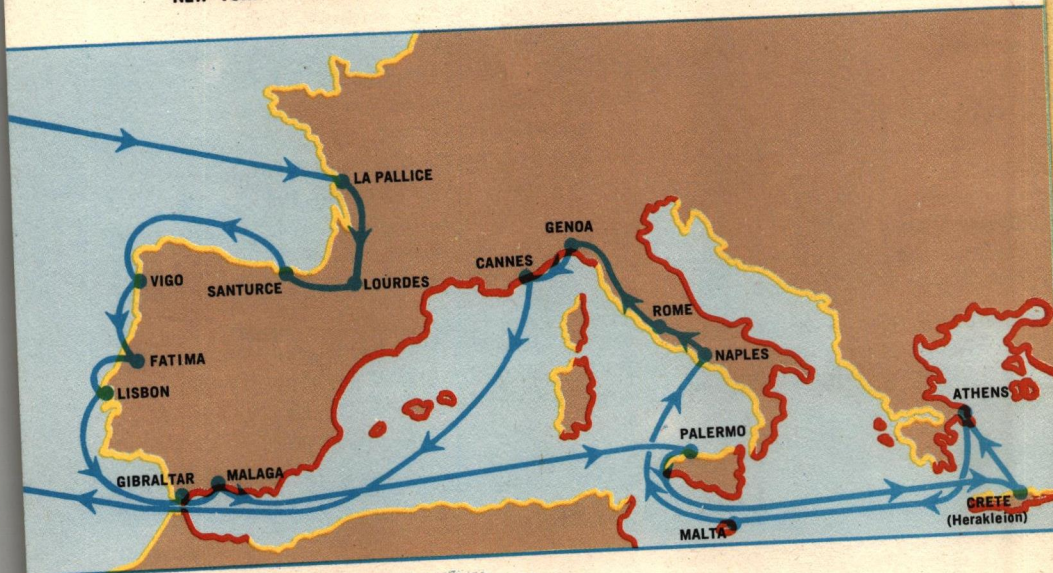
In addition, there is a spacious dining room, seating 580 passengers, and three outdoor swimming pools.
